EMPLOYEE AND JOB APPLICANT PRIVACY NOTICE

This Employee and Job Applicant Privacy Notice (“**Privacy Notice**”) applies to all job applicants, employees, independent contractors, or those who are otherwise engaged with or are being considered for engagement on an employment, contractual, or professional basis with Magnet Forensics, Inc and its affiliates (collectively, “**MFI,**” “**Company,**” “**us,**” “**we,**” or “**our**”). The purpose of this Privacy Notice is to inform you of our practices regarding the collection, use, and disclosure of your Personal Information and the rights you may have regarding such Personal Information.

This Privacy Notice is supplemental to our website Privacy Policy and other documents that may govern your relationship with us. In addition, any local notices or privacy-related disclosures specific to your country of residence shall supersede this Privacy Notice, the degree to which there is a conflict.

Unless otherwise noted, the disclosures herein cover our activities in the twelve (12) months preceding the Effective Date, as well as our current practices.

I. Personal Information We Collect, Use, and Disclose

As used in this Privacy Notice, the term “**Personal Information**” means information that identifies, relates to, describes, is reasonably capable of being associated with, or could reasonably be linked, directly or indirectly, with an individual. Personal Information does not include information that is publicly available, de-identified, or aggregated. We collect the following categories of Personal Information:

- **Personal Identifiers** (E.g., name, alias, telephone number, email address, mailing address, IP address, or other similar identifiers)
- **Sensitive Personal Identifiers** (E.g., social security number, driver’s license number, or other government identification number)
- **Characteristics of Protected Classifications** (E.g., age, marital status, race, ethnic origin, sex, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, military or veteran status, medical condition, and disability)
- **Professional or Employment Information** (E.g., skills, qualifications, work experience, references, recommendations; Answers to behavioral or other screening questions in an application or interview; Information relating to professional licenses, training, or disciplinary actions; Government security clearances, where applicable and as voluntarily disclosed)
- **Performance Information** (E.g., performance evaluations, disciplinary actions)
- **Internet or Other Electronic Network Activity Information** (E.g., browser type and language, operating system, website usage, emails, or text message communications)
- **Inferences** (E.g., information used to create a profile reflecting your preferences, characteristics, psychological trends, predispositions, behavior, attitudes, intelligence, abilities, and aptitudes)
- **Education Information** (E.g., school(s) attended, grades, and other information relating to your education)
- **Sensory Information** (E.g., security camera recordings if you interview at our facilities, photographs to the extent contained on documents you provide, audio recordings of phone calls and/or phone interviews)
- **Geolocation Data** (E.g., location data inferred from your device IP address, or your device and mobile location)
- **Onboarding Information** (E.g., payroll information such as bank account numbers;

benefits information such as insurance selections; beneficiary information such as name and relationship of beneficiary)

- **Offboarding Information** (E.g., end date of employment or contract)
- **Background Check Information** (E.g., name, date of birth, social security number (or equivalent), criminal offenses;
- **Identity Verification** (E.g., name, date of birth, government issued photo identification)
- **Electronic Signature**
- **Citizenship and Immigration Status**

In addition to the categories of Personal Information above, we may also collect Personal Information that you submit to us on a voluntary basis which we would not otherwise request. For example, information included on your CV when you submit an application to us, information submitted to any chat, email, or support function, or other information you may volunteer.

Depending on your jurisdiction, certain additional categories of information may be exempt from applicable privacy law, such as information subject to other laws and regulations. Not all categories of personal information are collected from every individual, depending on applicable privacy and or employment law in a given jurisdiction. Please ask Magnet Human Resources for more information if you have questions about the requirements or prohibitions in your jurisdiction.

To the extent permissible under applicable law in your jurisdiction, certain information may be provided, reviewed, confirmed on a video call with Magnet Human Resources. For example, identity verification may be conducted virtually. Video calls where sensitive information is provided, reviewed, or confirmed are not recorded.

For information about the Personal Information collected through cookies or other tracking technologies via our website (E.g., if you apply through the website), please see our Cookie Policy.

II. Disclosing Your Personal Information

We may disclose each of the categories of Personal Information identified above for operational or business purposes consistent with the reasons for collection or reasons for use designated. For example, we may disclose your information with third parties that support MFI in conducting background checks, processing payroll, providing benefits, or similar processing activity related to your relationship with MFI. Disclosure is as reasonably necessary and proportionate to achieve the identified purposes, or for other purposes permissible under applicable law, including:

- Helping to ensure security and integrity;
- Debugging, repairing, and improving functionality;
- Short-term, transient use;
- Performing services on our behalf;
- Internal research for technological development; and
- Verifying quality and/or safety.

In addition to the other purposes for collection, use, and disclosure of Personal Information described in this Privacy Notice, we may collect, use, and disclose Personal Information as required by law, regulation or court order; to respond to governmental and/or law enforcement requests; to identify, contact or bring legal action against someone who may be causing injury to or interfering with our or others' rights or property; to support any actual or threatened claim, defense or

declaration in a case or before any jurisdictional and/or administrative authority, arbitration or mediation panel; or in connection with disciplinary actions/investigations. Likewise, we may use and disclose Personal Information to other parties in connection with the sale, assignment, merger, or reorganization.

III. Sources of Personal Information

We may collect Personal Information from the following sources:

- **Directly from you.** (E.g., throughout the application process with us, including through our IT systems, company forms, and other processes where you submit information to us)
- **Automatically when you use our electronic systems.** (E.g., your usage history when you use our websites, systems, and applications.)
- **Automatically when you visit our facilities.** (E.g., security camera footage or badge access logs.)
- **From service providers that help us run our business.** (E.g., information technology vendors and other third party service providers, within the context of your employment or application.)
- **From publicly available sources.** (E.g., information lawfully made available to the general public from federal, state, or local government records).
- **From unaffiliated third parties.** MFI may collect information from customers, associates, or others that you may have engaged with in the course of your employment (e.g., customer surveys). If you are a job applicant using a third-party search engine, a social media platform (e.g., LinkedIn), or a recruiter that is not affiliated with MFI, MFI may receive some of your Personal Information indirectly through those respective sources. Please be advised that this Privacy Notice does not apply to external third parties and MFI has no control over the privacy practices of external third parties.

IV. How Long We Retain Your Personal Information

Depending on the purposes for collection, Personal Information may be retained for as long as one of the following apply:

- Retention is reasonably necessary to manage our operations, to manage your relationship with us, or to satisfy another purpose for which we collected the Personal Information;
- Retention is reasonably necessary to carry out a disclosed purpose that is reasonably compatible with the context in which the Personal Information was collected;
- Retention is reasonably required to protect or defend our rights or property (which will generally relate to applicable laws that limit actions in a particular case); or
- We are otherwise required or permitted to keep Personal Information by applicable laws or regulations.

Where Personal Information is used for more than one purpose, it will be retained at least as long as the latest period provides. Under some circumstances, we may maintain Personal Information indefinitely according to legal or regulatory requirements, including applicable legal holds, or for data backup or recovery purposes. In certain jurisdictions, the length of time that your Personal Information will be retained may vary depending on local law. You may inquire with your manager or contact us as described here for the retention period that is specific to your jurisdiction.

V. Artificial Intelligence

Certain systems that MFI utilizes across the enterprise may contain artificial intelligence (AI). MFI may use AI to perform certain tasks. For example, MFI may use AI to transcribe meetings or job interviews, draft communications, summarize documents, or prioritize projects. When required, your express consent will be obtained. MFI does not use AI to make decisions related to employment, including hiring, promoting, terminating, or similar.

Magnet does not use Personal Information to train Generative AI models internally and generally prohibits vendors from training vendor models with Personal Information. All AI tools go through both Security and Legal review prior to implementation to ensure that such tools align with Magnet's internal Acceptable Use of AI Policy. You are encouraged to adjust and or confirm the privacy settings in the systems you interact with.

VI. International Data Transfers

If you are located outside of the United States, please be aware that Personal Information we obtain about you will be processed in the United States or in other jurisdictions and may be accessed by the courts, law enforcement, and national security authorities in those jurisdictions. By providing your Personal Information, you acknowledge and consent to the international transfer and processing of your Personal Information as described in the Privacy Notice. Please be aware that the data protection laws and regulations that apply to your Personal Information transferred to the United States or other countries may be different from the laws in your country of residence.

VII. Data Privacy Rights (European Union and Similar Jurisdictions)

i. Privacy Rights for Residents of Canada

If you would like to submit a request to access, correct, erase, or obtain a copy of Personal Information we maintain about you, or if you like to receive written information about our policies and practices regarding services providers outside of Canada, please email us at dpo@magnetforensics.com. We may require specific information from you to help us verify your identity prior to processing your request. Applicable law may require or permit us to decline your request. If we decline your request, we will tell you why, subject to any legal restrictions on disclosing this information.

Magnet Forensics, Inc. is the data controller for personal information collected in the context of this Privacy Notice.

a. Our Legal Bases for Processing Your Personal Information

Your Personal Information is processed under the following legal bases:

- The processing is necessary for us to engage in an employment or contractual relationship with you.
- We have a legal obligation to process your personal information, such as compliance with applicable laws, regulations, or court orders
- We process personal information to achieve our legitimate interests of providing, improving and personalizing the experiences of users of our Services. We also process personal information to help ensure the security and integrity of our Services. When we rely on our legitimate interests, we take into account the

effects that these actions might have on you. If you have questions about our decisions regarding our legitimate interests, you may contact us

Your Rights:

- **Right to Know.** You have the right to know what Personal Information we have collected about you, which includes:
 - (1) The categories of Personal Information we have collected about you, including:
 - a. The categories of sources from which the Personal Information was collected;
 - b. Our business purposes for collecting the Personal Information;
 - c. The categories of recipients to which we disclose Personal Information;
 - d. The categories of Personal Information that we disclosed for a business purpose, and for each category identified, the categories of recipients to which we disclosed that particular category of Personal Information.
 - (2) The specific pieces of Personal Information we have collected about you.
- **Right to Delete Your Personal Information.** You have the right to request that we delete Personal Information we collected from you, subject to certain exceptions. You will be informed if an exception applies.
- **Right to Correct Inaccurate Information.** If you believe that Personal Information we maintain about you is inaccurate, you have the right to request that we correct that information.
- **Right to Opt-Out of Sales and Sharing of Personal Information.** We do not sell Personal Information in the context of this Privacy Notice or share it for cross-context behavioral advertising.
- **Right to Limit Use and Disclosure of Sensitive Personal Information.** We do not use or disclose Sensitive Personal Information for purposes to which the right to limit use and disclosure applies under the CCPA.

iv. Text/SMS Messages

You may opt in to receiving text messages on the mobile phone number(s) you share with us during the application process. By participating, you consent to receive text messages sent by an automatic telephone dialing system, which may contain recruiting/advertising messages. Consent to these terms is not a condition of being hired, contracted, or leased. You may opt out at any time by replying “STOP” to any text/SMS message you receive from us or contact us as described herein. You also agree that MFI's service providers may receive in real time and log your text messages with MFI.

v. Opt-Out Preference Signals

Our website recognizes the Global Privacy Control (“GPC”) signal. If you are using a browser setting or a plug-in that sends an opt-out preference signal to each website you visit, we will treat that as a valid request to opt out. Some internet browsers incorporate a “Do Not Track” feature that signals to websites you visit that you do not want to have your online activity tracked. Given that there is not a uniform way that browsers communicate the “Do Not Track” signal, Our website does not currently interpret, respond to or alter its practices when it receives “Do Not Track” signals sent by browsers, mobile devices, or other mechanisms.

vi. Storage Location of the Personal Information We Collect

Your personal data is processed, hosted, and/or stored by us in Quebec, Canada. For certain business practices, third-party providers may have access to your data. These third-party providers are typically vendors of cloud services or other IT hosting services located in Canada or USA. We also may provide your personal data to such third-party providers or our partners as part of the sales cycle. This can include both pre-sales activities such as lead generation and activities related to processing orders. When using third-party providers and partners, as required by applicable law, Magnet Forensics will enter into a data processing agreement to safeguard your privacy rights. When third-party providers and partners are located outside the EU, Magnet Forensics ensures legal grounds for such international transfers by relying on cross-border transfer agreements or using the EU Model Clauses.

We take steps to ensure that your information is treated securely and in accordance with this Privacy Notice. Unfortunately, no system is 100% secure, and we cannot ensure or warrant the security of any information you provide to us. To the fullest extent permitted by applicable law, we do not accept liability for unauthorized access, use, disclosure, or loss of Personal Information.



By using providing Personal Information to us, you agree that we may communicate with you electronically regarding security, privacy, and administrative issues relating to your use of our Services. If we learn of a security system's breach, we may attempt to notify you electronically by posting a notice on our Services, by mail, or by sending an email to you.

viii. Change in Statement

We reserve the right to amend this Privacy Notice at any time without advance notice in order to address future developments of MFI, our website, or changes in industry or legal trends.
